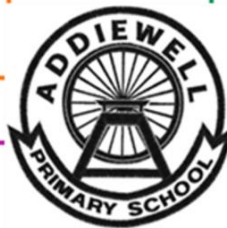

We plan to continue to carry out a number of targeted interventions across the school.

These will include –

- Targeted after school clubs to increase participation
- Box clever literacy intervention to increase vocabulary within P2 to P4.
- Targeted writing interventions focusing on the core writing targets
- Further develop work undertaken on the Numicon Intervention Program
- Promote family engagement in learning through home learning experiences for Primary 1 to 3.
- Work with families to increase attendance levels at school.

Pupils and parent's views have been sought. Pupils through huddle assemblies and parents at Parental consultation.
